Broccolily Theatre was founded in 2014 by Ruby Thompson and Samuel Caseley to make high quality theatre for young people. By traveling to their audiences and clearing the path for them to come to the theatre, they ensure their work is always accessible. They are interested in the unheard voices and stories that surround us, be them huge or tiny, with a focus on the tales of young people. Broccolily Theatre believe that theatre for young people should be as exciting and innovative as any.

Broccolily Theatre's work includes *Ten Foot Tales* at Hull Truck Theatre, a show for children written by children from Hull. Through workshops with Broccolily Theatre, pupils at Bridgeview Whitehouse Sullivan centre created four stories that were turned into a professional play. This sort of interaction lies at the heart of Broccolily Theatre's work.

Other work includes a tour of *The Boy Who Grew a Twisty Tale* by Sonia Jalaly, which was commissioned by Hull Libraries, and *Square Patties and Other Scraps* which was produced for Assemble Fest 2016.
